THE GREATEST KALED SCIENTIST

His father wishes Davros to follow in his footsteps and join the military; his mother believes that the war against the Thals will not be won by politicians or soldiers - in the end, scientists will bring victory for the Kaled race, and so Davros must pursue a life of science.

Of course, Davros must learn to express his own desires and mould his own destiny. And in time, he does just that...



**I, DAVROS**  
PURITY (2006)

The second part of "I, Davros" concentrates mostly on a mission into Thal territory. Davros, now a man, is determined to leave the Kaled military but he must first join an expedition that will go behind enemy lines and enter the Thal city.

Once there, he discovers that the Thals have indeed been busy building rockets that could result in victory against the Kaleds.

Sabotaging the installation after almost becoming a prisoner of the Thals, Davros flees with his team into the dangerous Wastelands...

His remaining team are killed, one by one, by mutations that live in the Wastelands. But Davros thinks not of his men - he is far more fascinated by the creatures themselves, and how their discovery could lead to future survival for the Kaled race. This moment will take Davros in a whole new direction. The birth of a famous monster looms...

Certainly one of the saddest moments in this part is when Lady Calcula discovers that Davros' own sister, Yarvell, was responsible for almost getting her brother captured by the Thals. Yarvell is part of a peace movement that believes in putting an end to the war without further bloodshed.

After finding out about the top secret mission from Davros himself (who had blurted it out after an impassioned moment), Yarvell had quickly informed her friends - who sent word to the Thal government, warning them of the plan.

Of course, we know that Davros escaped. But Yarvell's deception could have resulted in his death. Unable to accept this betrayal, Lady Calcula drowns her own daughter.



**I, DAVROS**  
CORRUPTION (2006)

In the third installment of the series we experience two major incidents in Davros' life. Firstly, his mother, Lady Calcula, dies after betrayal by a fellow Kaled. But Davros merely sees her death as a scientific opportunity to develop his understanding of genetics. It is here that we see his true detachment from emotion - he does not allow feelings to get in the way of his work.

Also, following a missile attack, Davros is almost killed. What he becomes from this point on is a severely scarred, crippled shell of a man, kept alive by a life support system.

The Davros that we were introduced to in Genesis of The Daleks is born...

### GENESIS OF A MONSTER

Did the story of Davros, creator of the Daleks, really begin with Genesis of the Daleks? Or, as some accept, was the genesis of Davros a tale of a young sixteen year-old boy seeking answers?

Wherever you decide to begin, the long war between Kaleds and Thals is apparent, both sides looking for victory.



**I, DAVROS**  
INNOCENCE (2006)

Let us now take a look at Davros' early years, and thanks to Big Finish we can do just that!

Davros is on trial.

But he is needed by the Daleks - for they have lost direction. They have become ghosts of their past.

What we experience with "I, Davros" is a journey through Davros' past, exploring what made him become the Kaled that we now know.

In "Innocence", the first of four parts, we are introduced to Davros as a sixteen year-old boy. He is residing with his parents, Lady Calcula (an ambitious politician and over-protective mother) and Colonel Nasgard (his military father), and sister Yarvell.



## I, DAVROS GUILT (2006)

And so we reach the final part of the series. It is here that we welcome the return of Peter Miles, who reprises his role as Nyder (a character we were introduced to in Genesis of The Daleks).

Explosives primed and ready. Red, amber, blue and red: the code that detonates the bomb at the Kaled Science Dome. The medical centre is hit worst, and Davros is at the mercy of the Thals.

Now in the hands of the enemy, and separated from his life-support chariot, Davros is questioned. But he refuses to talk. This is where Left-tenant Nyder is introduced, a loyal Kaled soldier who will obey orders without question.

Storming the Thal complex, Nyder and his men search for Davros - taking no prisoners along the way. They eventually rescue the Kaled scientist, and he is returned home.

Recovering from his ordeal, Davros now has his eyes set on further experiments. Children - all Kaled children - will be taken from their families and housed elsewhere, if permission is granted by the Council. Of course the idea is too horrible to contemplate and so the Supremo, leader of the Kaled people, denies the request.

But Davros refuses to take "no" for an answer.

"<XTERMINAT<!"

Tiny bombs swimming in the bloodstreams of all Council members - and the Supremo - are detonated, killing them all!

The children now in his hands, Davros resumes his genetic work, changing the future of the Kaled race forever.

A major highlight of this episode is hearing the voice talents of Nicholas Briggs as Thal spy Baran and Lisa Bowerman as Colonel Murash.

Infiltrating Kaled headquarters, Baran spends much of the episode skulking about in search of information.

Knowledge of a Thal spy at loose in Kaled territory is known but his identity is yet to



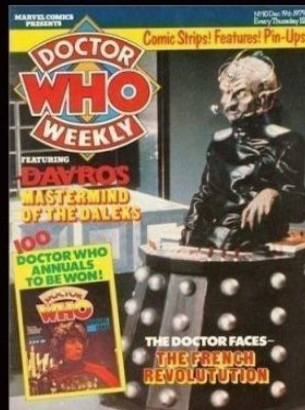
be uncovered. As "Guilt" draws to a close, Baran is at last captured by Davros and Nyder, and overwhelmed. In an ironic twist, it is indeed Baran (a Thal) who becomes the first Dalek - known here as a "Mark I".

## GENESIS OF THE DALEKS

(1975)

Soldiers clad in gas masks, gunned down by the enemy.

The Doctor emerges from a mist. He meets a fellow Time Lord. This is Skaro, planet of the Daleks, and the Time Lords have brought him here - to this time and place - for a mission...

So what do we learn by watching Genesis? Well, for a start, we have arrived at a point before the events that occurred in the 1963 Doctor Who story "The Daleks", also known as "The Mutants".

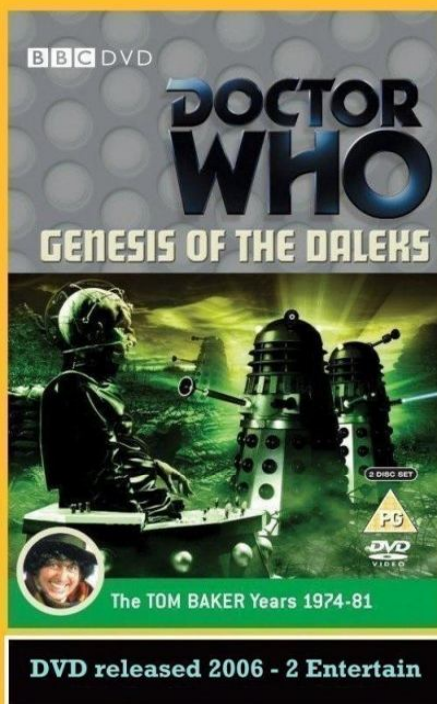
Here the Thals are at war with a race called Kaleds (a clever name derived from an anagram of Daleks) and there seems to be no end to the conflict.

But there is hope for the Kaled race! A scientific genius, Davros, has developed a Mark III Travel Machine, soon to be known as a Dalek! With this new weapon there can at last be peace - and total destruction of the Thal race!

There are, however, concerns amongst some at the Scientific Elite, a Kaled infrastructure. They fear that Davros, their leader, is threatening the future of the Kaled people because of his infatuation with the "Dalek".

And their fears are well based. When Davros discovers that there is a movement against him, he turns on them, aiding the Thals in destroying the Kaled dome. Later, the Daleks murder those who are not loyal to Davros - but the true terror of the Daleks is unleashed when they eventually turn on their own creator!

Daleks are, after all, the superior beings in the Universe - and no humanoid should be permitted to live.

### Michael Wisher



**Davros: "Today, the Kaled race is ended - consumed in a fire of war. But from its ashes will rise a new race. The supreme creature! The ultimate conqueror of the universe! The Dalek!"**

The character of Davros is an interesting one. And the casting even more so... Michael Wisher had already played a number of roles in Doctor Who episodes when given the opportunity to portray the creator of the Daleks - he had even voiced Daleks too!

And what an impact Wisher made! His Davros is undoubtedly the strongest; a performance that would be difficult to equal.

So what was the Doctor's mission? He was asked to avert the creation of the Daleks, or find a weakness in their genetic makeup.

Of course, in 2005 (when Doctor Who returned to television after a long absence) we discovered that Time Lords and Daleks had been engaged in a Time War - so is Genesis the instigation of those future events?

It certainly looks that way!

And the Doctor's mission on Skaro failed. The Daleks continued to spread death, chaos and terror throughout the Universe!

For us "fans", however, the thrill of Genesis was the introduction of a magnificent villain, a "humanoid" Dalek that could be just as ruthless as the beings he had created...

DAVROS would return!

## DESTINY OF THE DALEKS

(1979)

The Doctor is busy repairing K9; Romana (full name: Romanadvoratrelundar) is regenerating, trying on different bodies to see which one suits her best - she eventually settles on a Princess-Astra-look, a character they encountered on the planet Atrios (see 1979 story The Armageddon Factor for reference).

Reasons for this regeneration scene are debated by fans; can a Time Lady regenerate at will?

The TARDIS eventually brings them to a planet with high levels of radiation. A couple of anti-radiation pills solves that problem.

Outside the TARDIS, the Doctor hits his head, something occurs to him:

**Romana:** What is it?

**Doctor:** I don't know. Feeling I've been here before.

**Romana:** Deja vu?

**Doctor:** Oui.

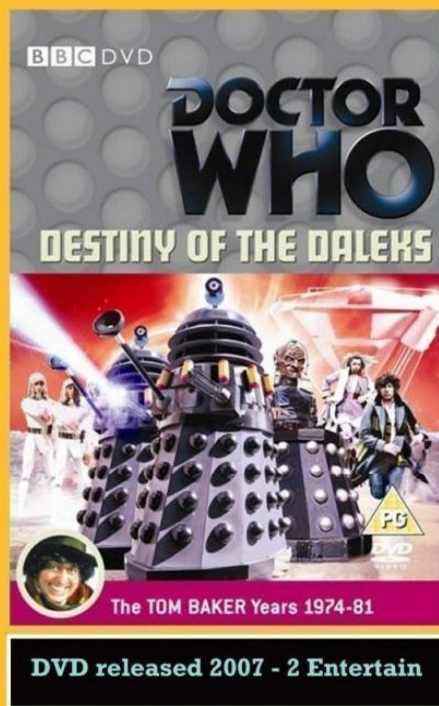
**Romana:** There's something you recognise?

**Doctor:** Nothing tangible. I just have a sensation.

And, of course, we, the viewers, understand the reason. Or, at least, we will, as the story unfolds.

They discover the ruins of a city. And tremors - underground machinery is at work! And a small group of people - wretched and weak - bury one of their own, a comrade who has succumb to the harsh conditions of the planet - and slavery. He died of exhaustion and malnutrition!

This is Skaro - planet of the Daleks. And the Kaled mutants have returned home in search of something valuable: Davros!

### David Gooderson



The mask that sculptor John Friedlander original made for Michael Wisher (Genesis) was reused here, in Destiny. The only problem was that the mask did not fit David Gooderson so well, the actor chosen to portray Davros in this adventure (Wisher was unable to reprise the role due to other commitments).

What we get from Gooderson is a fragile performance that struggles to justify itself through the four-part story. The Davros that we see here is lacking the main ingredients that made him so compelling in Genesis. A ghost of his former self perhaps... Having said that, Davros has been dead for years! Maybe

disorientation was to blame. And Davros's strange look due to... decay? Let's move on to other matters...

As the story evolves we find that the Daleks are at war with a race known as Movellans, and an impasse has been reached between the two empires. The Daleks believe that Davros can help them break this deadlock and win the war.

"If you're supposed to be the superior race in the universe, why don't you try climbing after us?" The Doctor says to a Dalek after ascending to a higher level in the old Kaled structure.

In the end, the Daleks are defeated by the Doctor; Davros is imprisoned; and the Movellans turn out to be androids - their task force on Skaro (sorry, did I not mention that?) is overpowered by... um, the Doctor!

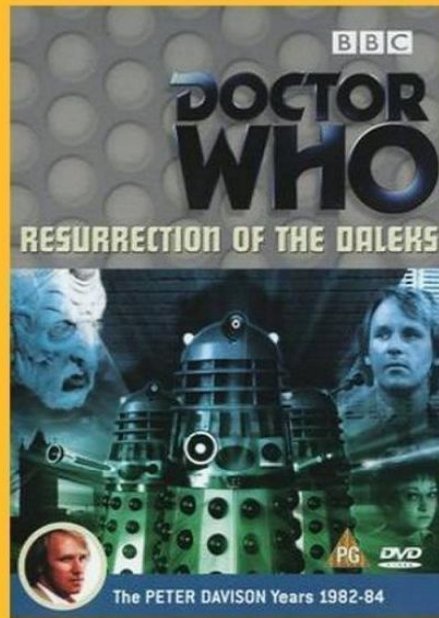
In Resurrection we view two time zones: the late Twentieth Century, and sometime in the future.

with in Genesis? Well, I'm sure you know what I mean.

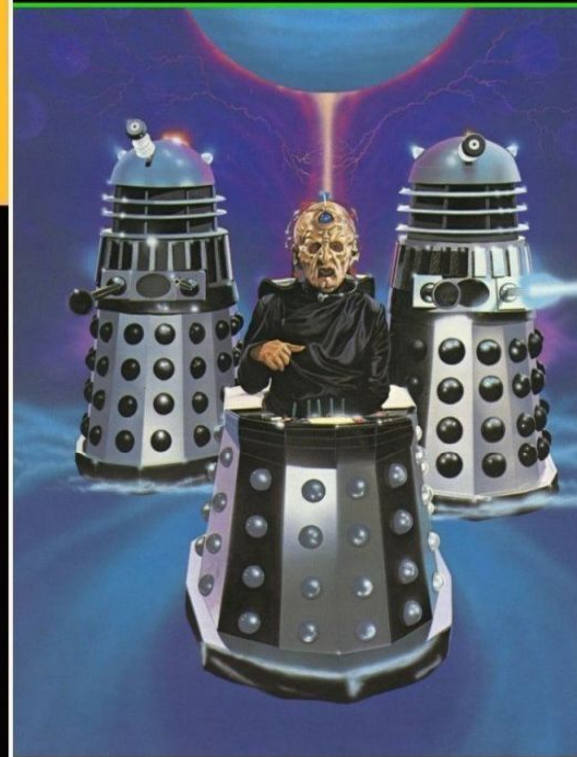
As is the way of all things, the Daleks are destroyed (don't they ever learn?) and even Davros succumbs to defeat in the end - a victim of his own genius!

Tranquil Repose, a facility on a planet called Necros, is where the wealthy can have their newly-deceased bodies cryogenically frozen; when medical science discovers a cure for whatever killed them, they can be revived, and live again.

Wishing to pay his last respects to old friend Professor Arthur Stengos, the Doctor (and companion Peri) lands on Necros. But there is a mystery, something that the Time Lord suspects is wrong - and his suspicions are justified!

A trap has been set in motion!

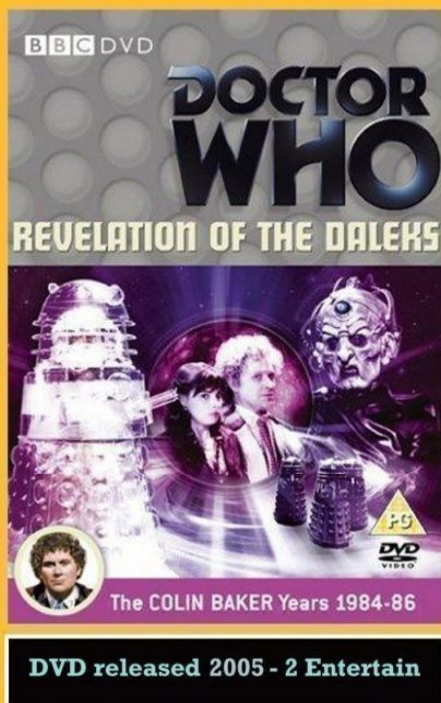
The mastermind behind Tranquil Repose is an alien known as The Great Healer. But he is also known by another name: Davros!

The evil Kaled scientist is "using the organic material in the cryogenic storage units both as the raw material for the synthetic food that is Necros's biggest export and also to create a whole new army of Daleks with which to take control of the universe."

What we discover in "Revelation" is that Davros - and in "Remembrance" his white and gold Daleks - can hover. And that Davros has begun to construct a new race of Daleks for supremacy.

But there are now two Dalek factions: those that have been "born" on Necros (loyal to Davros) and those that have allegiance to the Supreme Dalek. Of course, at this point in time, it is the latter that has the upper hand, a Dalek empire that has decided to arrest their creator and place him on trial.

And for the time being, he is powerless to stop them!

Molloy was also the first actor to reprise the role of Davros - both Wisher and Gooderson had only played the character once.

**The Doctor:** Did you bother to tell anyone they may be eating their own relatives?

**Davros:** Certainly not! That would have created what I believe is called consumer resistance.

London, 1963. The Doctor, accompanied by companion Ace, investigates the scene: a parked van outside Coal Hill School, from which protrudes a very sophisticated antenna for the era.

Leaving the Doctor to his "work", Ace visits a local cafe and orders four bacon sandwiches and a cup of coffee.

The Doctor discovers scorch marks in the playground of the school, and a young girl watches him, seeming to know his identity: "Five, six, seven, eight, it's a doctor at the gate," she says to herself.

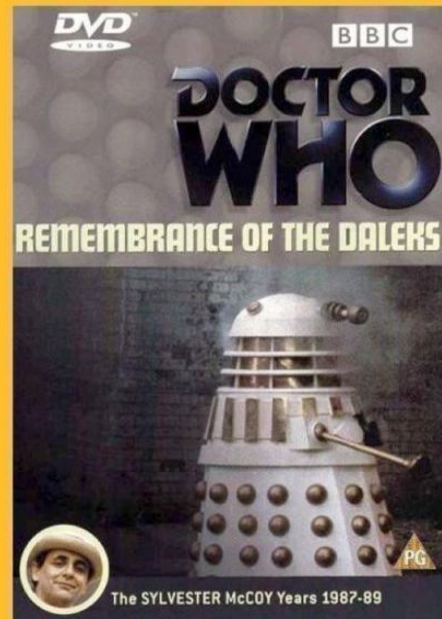
Climbing into the back of the van, the Doctor discovers scientific instrumentation and meets Professor Rachel Jensen, member of a special team.

In the cafe, Ace unknowingly befriends another member of that team: Sergeant Mike Smith.

As events unfold, we are whisked to No. 76 Totters Lane, also known as Forman Yard, Scrap Merchant. It is a place that the Doctor has visited before - during his first incarnation (although back then the spelling of No. 76 was spelt differently, as "Foreman Yard").

But what we discover in this place is a threat that the Doctor has been prepared for - Daleks!

As with Revelation, we learn that there are two Dalek factions, except this time the tables have turned and the white and gold Daleks are now the supreme beings - those loyal to the Supreme Dalek seem to be few in number.

The return of Davros was to be kept quiet until the moment of his unveiling in Part Four. Terry Molloy, who played Davros, was even credited by the pseudonym of Roy Tromelly in Part Three to keep the Kaled's appearance a secret.

In Remembrance we see Daleks elevate for the very first time - although we did get a glimpse of Davros's chariot hovering in previous story Revelation.

As the plot thickens we discover that the Daleks are after the Hand of Omega, a remote stellar manipulator that can create or modify stars through artificial means.

It would make a powerful weapon!

But the Doctor is unconcerned.

In my opinion Bleach did the (almost) impossible: he delivered a performance that was both spine-chilling and true to the character.

Just as it was after Wisler's performance in Genesis, it was always going to be a difficult task to follow on from Molloy's genius. But in this two-parter we discovered an actor who didn't just give us Davros - he became him!

And, of course, that is what a good actor is supposed to do. But there's no harm in giving credit to an "excellent!" actor!



As The Stolen Earth (first part of the story) draws to a close, the Doctor is reunited with old companion Rose (the walls of reality are breaking down, allowing her to cross over from her parallel world to our own).

But danger nears... a solitary Dalek spots the Doctor - and fires at the Time Lord. In the final moments of the episode we watch as the Doctor begins to regenerate...

Of course - he doesn't. In an unexpected plot twist, the Doctor transfers the regeneration energy into a container which houses his severed hand (originally lost after a sword fight with the Sycorax Leader - see "The Christmas Invasion"). He has healed himself, but chosen not to change his appearance.



There is much complexity with this two-part story, which only deepens as we are introduced to a "new" Doctor, born from the energy within the severed hand.

A "Human" Doctor, who only has one heart and has picked up some of Donna's mannerisms. In turn, Donna has gained Time Lord knowledge.

Now we have two Doctors and a companion whose own mind appears to surpass their own. But it is dangerous - no Human should ever have that much knowledge; no Human mind could ever cope with it!

"Journey's End" concludes in spectacular - and heartfelt - fashion...

## A QUESTION OF GOODBYE



### WHERE IS THE TENTH DOCTOR GOING?



There is absolutely no doubt that *The End of Time*, a two-part story that allowed us all to say farewell to actor David Tennant, was an emotional rollercoaster.

The return of arch-nemesis the Master, and the Time Lords... the Doctor regenerating...

It was all designed to make us smile, laugh, cry... all of those things and more. But there is one thing that bothers me: the Tenth Doctor's final words.

"I don't want to go."

Why, where is he going?

Let us take a look at the logic surrounding his ability to regenerate, and put those words into some kind of perspective...

Why does a Time Lord regenerate? Well, to stave off death. But, of course, it isn't immortality. No where near it. The process permits a body to undergo "change" only so

many times - thirteen lives in total. After that, a Time Lord will succumb to death, unless he is given a completely new regenerative life cycle, or finds another means to stave off the inevitable.

The Master had discovered such a way at one point, by "possessing" the bodies of other people.

But let us concentrate on regeneration. A change is as good as a rest, someone once said. Well, the Doctor has undergone the process of change several times now, his first being in 1966, when William Hartnell was replaced by fellow actor Patrick Troughton.

So what did we see? Well, the Doctor lay on the TARDIS floor, unconscious, watched over by companions Polly and Ben. There was a brief moment when no one knew what to expect - and then, right before our eyes, the Doctor's appearance began to alter. Slowly but surely, the first regeneration took place on our screens.

And what a clever device the show had been given: the ability to change the lead actor with a simple explanation.

And so the Doctor doesn't die, he merely changes from one appearance to another, his personality obviously changing accordingly.

Simple. Not that regeneration is simple. Such metabolic changes must be chaotic

and violent, as we have seen in recent regenerations. The stress must be almost insurmountable.

But change he does, and with it comes a new lease of life. A chance to see the cosmos with new eyes - literally!

Let us never forget, however, that although he is different in appearance, he is still the Doctor! He is the same man that travelled with his granddaughter, Susan. He is the same man that faced the Daleks on Skaro, and the same man that outwitted the Meddling Monk in 1066.

And although we think of him as the First Doctor, the Fourth, or even the Tenth Doctor and so on (making it easy for us to identify which of the Doctor's incarnations we are observing, or writing about)... the Doctor sees himself as just the one Time Lord - the Doctor!

He is far too aware that regeneration is merely a change from one state to another. It is not death. After the event he will still be the Doctor - and house the same memories, even if it does take him a little while to overcome the mental chaos that regeneration brings with it.

So, given that, why on earth would the Doctor say those immortal words: "I don't want to go"?

In answer to my earlier question, the Doctor is not going anywhere! Maybe those words are a reference to David Tennant or Russell T Davies having second thoughts about leaving the show? But the Doctor? No, those words should never be spoken from his lips - his story never ends, at least, not until he reaches the end of his final regeneration, and faces true death for the first time.

Maybe some people have forgotten who the Doctor really is, and now see each of his incarnations as different people. They are not different entities, they are different aspects of the same person, the same Time Lord.

If Russell T Davies wanted to be accurate, and give the Doctor something that actually made sense, then the following final words of the Time Lord should have been something like: "I don't want to change. I like who I am. I like who I have become", and then he regenerates - yes, there would be a sense of loss, not for a Doctor that has died (regeneration is not death!) but for a Doctor who felt comfortable in his own skin and who now knows that he must change, even against his will.

He will become a new aspect - not a new person. At the end of it all, the Doctor remains to face new perils and defeat yet more monsters.

So what should a new Doctor Who team learn from this? Well, simple: the Doctor, in all his incarnations, is one man, not someone who has died, only to be replaced by a new Time Lord. Regeneration is not death, but a means to hold it at bay for a while.

The Tenth Doctor (as we call him but he never refers to himself as) knew this, and so his final moments should have been in keeping with that knowledge.

They were not! Please don't get me wrong, all fans of the show are eternally grateful that Davies and his team brought Doctor Who back to our screens. But even the best of writers should know when they have got something wrong. Balance should always go hand in hand with logic. And in this case, logic went out the airlock...

## INTERVIEW WITH... DANIEL BLYTHE

EXCLUSIVE TO NEBULA ONE



**Hi Daniel, can you tell us a little about yourself?**

I was born in Maidstone in 1969 and went to Maidstone Grammar School and then to Oxford. Worked in a variety of jobs, mostly charity/ voluntary sector and in education, but always combining with writing.

These days I work on average 4 days a week on my writing and have a day or two a week where I'm out doing something else related to writing - a school visit, a workshop either freelance or with an arts organisation, etc. I also teach a regular Writing A Novel class. It's lovely to be asked to do all this extra stuff, and it's also really useful!

I'm married to Rachel, who is a teacher - we've been married for 11 years and have two children, Elinor, who is 9 and Sam, who will be 7 by the time people read this! Both big DW fans - they didn't really have a choice!

**What are your earliest memories of Doctor Who?**

Jon Pertwee turning into Tom Baker. I was aware right from the start that the Doctor could change his face. I was always too frightened to watch when I was a pre-schooler, but as soon as I started in Bottom Infants (as it was known then) everyone watched it - a birthday party I went to stopped for part 3 of Robot to be watched, in the dark!... And that sort of thing happens again now. My daughter's 8th birthday was on the day "The Doctor's Daughter" was shown. We had a living-room full of 8-year-olds all watching Doctor Who.

**Have you ever visited a Doctor Who convention / event? (And if yes) What is the experience like?**

When I was much younger I went to a couple and enjoyed the panels and the videos but didn't really mingle much. I only started going to the famous Fitzroy Tavern because a couple of fellow New Adventures writers dragged me along - I've not been much since! Recently I went to NovelCon at the award-winning Lass O'Gowrie pub in Manchester, as a guest, and that was great fun - I just turned into one of those people who stands in the bar

and chats to everyone. Really enjoyed that.

**Who, or what, inspires you?**

All sorts of things really. I imagine scenarios that might have happened if people had taken different routes in life. I'm inspired by everything I read and absorb aspects of writers' voices, I'm sure. I think after a decade and a half of being published I am still a beginner, still learning. I like to think I am not even halfway through my publishing career yet.

I was interviewing a young pop group for a potential new project the other day and we were all talking about this question of what drives people in the creative industries, when there are so many people out there ready to knock you and often so little reward at first. You have to have a real self-belief and want to do it no matter what.

**Congratulations on Autonomy becoming a No1 bestseller! So what was the inspiration for your 2009 novel?**

Justin Richards asked me if I fancied writing a book featuring the Nestenes. I said yes straight away because there is so much scope for playfulness as a writer - they aren't one-note villains, they exist in so many different manifestations and they have that wonderful dark Robert Holmes sense of the macabre.

It's a great privilege and great fun. I loved writing for the Doctor and trying to capture his character. It's great to be able to take ideas that older writers have come up with and develop them. I imagined how an entity which controls plastic might work in a 21st-century leisure and shopping complex - I especially enjoyed writing a

really nasty scene where a pushy journalist is swallowed by her 'living plastic' boots and dress. That was inspired by the plastic chair scene from 'Terror', of course.

**How have you grown artistically/creatively since writing your first Doctor Who novel, The Dimension Riders, for Virgin Books in 1993?**

I like to think I have learned a lot. I'm less visual as a writer and more character-driven. I like to think my writing is tighter and less showy.

I wrote two of the 1990s New Adventures novels, 'The Dimension Riders' and 'Infinite Requiem', featuring the 7th Doctor. I also wrote a short story for 'Decalog 2' featuring the Fifth Doctor and a short story for the Marvel DW yearbook featuring the Fourth Doctor. 'Autonomy' was exciting for me, as it was my first DW novel in 13 years and also my first for the tenth Doctor - and the first for which I was asked to write my own take on an old enemy.

But Doctor Who's just part of my writing. I've written three novels for adults, non-fiction on subjects as diverse as parenting and 80s pop, and various articles for magazines and so on. I've recently been paid to develop a scenario for an internet-based story which schoolchildren will contribute to and develop - another first for me! I'm always looking for new avenues and new ways to promote myself. I've had a website for four years now -

- and I'm on Facebook. Not yet been lured on to Twitter, but maybe it's only a matter of time!...

**Do you have a favourite Doctor(s)?**

Tom Baker is the Doctor I grew up with, and so he'll always be my favourite, I think. I've had the pleasure of meeting him a couple of times. He'll always be the Doctor for me. His episodes are the ones I return to most often on DVD. But I'm really enjoying a lot of the 1980s stories again with the benefit of distance - especially Peter Davison's work.

**What are your thoughts on the return of the series (2005-present)? Had it gained anything by its absence from television?**

I wish it hadn't been away for so long. But it couldn't really have come back with more of a vengeance. When people knock the new series I just want to sit them down in a room and ask them what, in fact, they actually \*want\*? We've got a new series of 13 episodes a year, getting some of the highest ratings ever, with the best British writing and directing talent, schoolkids all over the country being Daleks in the playground again and carrying Cyberman rucksacks and Ood pencil-cases around... I mean, this is a golden age, isn't it? No episode is perfect, we know that, but there isn't a figurative "alternative" new Doctor Who waiting in the wings in case this one fails. This is what we have. Do people really want to go back to the 1990s when all we had to get excited about was books, audios and a webcast??

**Besides writing, what else do you enjoy?**

Spending time with my children and enjoying the lovely scenery - and pubs! - of the Peak District on my doorstep. I keep meaning to take up more exercise and get out and about and see it more.

I'm interested in politics and have an unashamed love of pop music old and new.

**Do you have any projects/books planned for 2010?**

I have two books coming out this year. The first is "X Marks The Box", which is more or less out now - it's a book about politics and voting and will, I hope, get people engaged with politics again if they are disillusioned. The second is a nostalgia book for Pen and Sword, called "Gadgets, Games and Heroes" - that'll be out later in the year. I'm doing another for them called "Famous Robots", to be out in 2011.

I'm also working on a new novel, and I've got a children's novel with my agent, potentially the first in a series, and we are talking to various publishers about that. Several other non-fiction ideas in development too. Always something on the go!
